Promoting and Communicating Benefits of the Kosovo-Serbia EU Facilitated Dialogue

About the project:

The Project began in October 2018. The overall objective was to promote and communicate the benefits of the EU facilitated technical dialogue on the normalisation of relations between Kosovo and Serbia (Prishtina and Belgrade) to the wider public.

The activities focused on a number of communication and outreach activities, peer to peer cooperation, research and local engagement.

Results:

- Offered the wider public an insight into the benefits of the technical dialogue agreements and the history of their implementation through the publication of policy articles and TV debates.
- Contributed to informing members of local communities on the benefits of the technical dialogue and in positively changing their viewpoints on this matter through workshops and local roundtables.
- Fostered the debate on the technical dialogue and explored the existing knowledge and perception of the citizens in regards to the dialogue process and current agreements through a comprehensive research study.
- Provided an opportunity for peer to peer exchange of views between CSOs, media, youth leaders' and KSPAG members on the EU facilitated dialogue.
- Fostered the consolidation of a joint platform with common goals and voices which set an example of cooperation in the region.

Op-Eds & TV Debates contributed to:

- Informing the public on the content of the agreements and their impact from the perspective of different authors;
- Highlighting the benefits of the technical agreements and bringing them to the attention of the wider public;

- Inform the public on the research findings on the citizens' perspectives on the benefits of the technical dialogue through two major conferences in Prishtina and Belgrade.

Workshops

The Achievements of the Kosovo-Serbia Technical Dialogue - Lipjan/Liplajne



KSPAG and I4PA organised the first workshop "The Achievements of the Kosovo-Serbia Technical Dialogue" with participants from civil society and youth representatives from the municipality of Lipjan/Lipljane. The discussion was centred on the achievements and benefits stemming from the process and the necessity of youth involvement.

The Benefits of the Technical Dialogue – Vushtrri/Vučitrn



In cooperation with I4PA, KSPAG organised "The Benefits of the Technical Dialogue" workshop in Vushtrri with participants from civil society in Mitrovicë/Mitrovica, Vushtrri/Vučitrn and Obliq/Obilič. Twenty-two representatives from local NGOs and the public discussed the Kosovo-Serbia dialogue process and the benefits of the agreements reached between the two governments.

The Achievements of Technical Dialogue and Their Impact on the Lives of Citizens - Ferizaj/Uroševac



The third workshop on promoting and communicating the achievements of the technical dialogue and impact on the daily lives of citizens was held in Ferizaj/Uroševac. The workshop chronologically elaborated the process of the technical dialogue, the agreements that derived from it and the benefits for citizens in Kosovo and Serbia.



Technical Dialogue: Benefits and Opportunities - Kamenica



The workshop engaged with local CSOs to discuss the benefits of the Kosovo-Serbia technical dialogue and served as an opportunity for participants to share their experiences of the benefits of technical dialogue, as well as their views and expectations of the dialogue process.

Roundtables

Technical Agreements between Belgrade and Pristina - Transport, Energy, Trade - Kraljevo



This roundtable brought together representatives of CSOs working on European integration, experts and representatives of business community to discuss the agreements on the judiciary, energy and telecommunications.

Positive Outcomes of the Implementation of Technical Agreements - North Mitrovica



The roundtable discussed the benefits of the technical agreements, with a special focus on their impact on the Kosovo Serb and other communities. The two session roundtable elaborated on how the implementation of technical agreements has impacted the life of the Kosovo Serb community. The roundtable acknowledged the necessity for greater inclusion of citizens in the dialogue process.

Agreements and Cooperation between Belgrade and Pristina - Energy, Trade, Regional Development" - Novi Pazar



The roundtable brought together representatives of civil society, experts and members of the local business communities, who discussed the progress made so far on the implementation of technical agreements, their impact on citizens and the consequences they have on energy, trade and regional development.

Perspectives on the Implementation of the Technical Dialogue - Gjilan/Gnjilane



The roundtable discussed the differing perspectives and positive results from the implementation of the technical dialogue. The roundtable brought together citizens and representatives of NGOs from the Gjilan/Gnjilane region. The event facilitated discussion between the different communities and perspectives of people living in Kosovo and the impact the technical dialogue agreements have for those communities.

Seeking Inclusiveness: Roma, Ashkali and Egyptian Communities in Kosovo- Serbia Dialogue – Ferizaj/Uroševac



The roundtable engaged the Roma, Ashkali and Egyptian communities in a discussion about the benefits of the technical dialogue and attained their perspective. The discussion outlined a number of benefits deriving from the EU facilitated dialogue affecting the lives of these communities. Positive examples from the agreements on freedom of movement and civil registry were highlighted.

Youth Perspective on the Benefits of Technical Dialogue Agreements - Peja/Peč



The roundtable discussed the benefits and the impact of the technical dialogue from the youth perspective. The youth representatives provided their views and expectations from the technical dialogue process and emphasised the need for a greater involvement of youth in this process.



Seminars

Influence of technical agreements on the rule of law and security in the process of normalization of the relations between Belgrade and Pristina - Belgrade



The seminar brought together Serbian and Albanian journalists and researchers from civil society organisations, working in Serbia and Kosovo. Participants discussed with the experts the progress made in the field of technical agreements between Prishtina and Belgrade, the impact on citizens and consequences on the rule of law, security and regional connection.

Conferences

Belgrade - Prishtina dialogue: do politicians hear the citizens? - Belgrade



The conference presented the KSPAG research findings on citizens' perceptions and knowledge of the technical agreements reached between Belgrade and Prishtina, and the impact on their daily lives. A discussion with panellists on the research findings followed the presentation.

The Impact of Kosovo-Serbia Technical Dialogue Agreements - Prishtina



The conference presented the KSPAG research report "Kosovo – Serbia Dialogue: Prishtina – Belgrade Technical Dialogue Agreements: Perceptions on the Ground". The report includes research findings on the views of Kosovo Albanians and Serbs and citizens in Serbia on the benefits and impact of the Kosovo-Serbia Technical Dialogue agreements.

Booklet Presentations

Perspectives on the Technical Dialogue Agreements between Kosovo and Serbia - Prishtina



The KSPAG booklet containing the project published articles was presented in roundtable discussion on the Kosovo – Serbia dialogue. The panel consisting of authors, CSO representatives and journalists from Kosovo and Serbia highlighted the positive aspects of the technical dialogue and identified the gaps in the process of implementation of the existing agreements.

Perspectives on the Technical Dialogue Agreements between Kosovo and Serbia - Belgrade



Two panel discussions followed the KSPAG booklet of articles presentation in Belgrade. The booklet presentation provided an opportunity to discuss the achievements and perspectives of the technical dialogue between Belgrade and Prishtina with panellists from representatives of CSOs, journalists and authors.

Peer-To-Peer Visits

Peer-to-Peer exchange of experiences on the technical dialogue - Prishtina



The visit brought together 15 young people from Serbia and 15 young people from Kosovo to discuss and exchange their experiences on the benefits of the technical dialogue between Prishtina and Belgrade and its impact on the lives of citizens. The peer to peer visit included a meeting with representatives of Innovation Center Kosovo (ICK), guest lecturers, and a visit to North and South Mitrovica.

KSPAG Consortium Meetings











The five KSPAG Steering Committee Meetings were organised throughout the project implementation in Prishtina, North Mitrovica and Belgrade. The meetings discussed the project implementation, challenges to the project and strengthened the coordination among the consortium members.

The challenging political and social environment hindering the project implementation was a major part of the discussion. The polarised political relations between Kosovo and Serbia and the discontinuation of the dialogue constituted the biggest challenge to the project implementation. As a result the project implementation was constantly adapted to the external environment so that it could achieve the best results.

Steering Committee meetings strengthened KSPAG cohesion. Future endeavours of KSPAG were discussed and concrete actions in fulfilling its vision were identified.


